

2017-18 Re-Registration Opens -Tuesday, January 17

Re-Register for the 2017-18 School Year

We are excited to be opening registration for the 2017-18 school year on January 17, 2017. We will be sending home registration packets with each student the week before registration opens. Below are the tuition rates and registration fees for the 2017-18 school year:

Pre-K Tuition	\$6,450
1 Child (K-8)	\$5,975
2 Children (K-8)	\$10,675
3+ Children (K-8)	\$15,575
Materials Fee	\$400
Registration Fee	\$100-\$195 (dependent on when you register)

You will notice that the tuition rate for one child in kindergarten through 8th grade is frozen at last year's rate. The Pre-K tuition and tuition rates for multiple children have gone up slightly.

We are offering a discount to families who register early. Families can save up to \$95 per child by registering early. See the discount opportunity below:

January 17 - February 13	\$100	\$95
February 14 - February 24	\$125	\$70
February 27 – March 13	\$150	\$45
March 14 – March 24	\$175	\$20
April 3 – August	\$195	\$0

Please make sure to register as early as possible. You benefit by saving money on tuition and fees, and our school benefits by getting sufficient time to plan our classrooms for next year. I will be discussing this further at the State of the School meeting on February 9.

Uniform Reminders

I included this reminder in the last newsletter, but I want to continue to remind families to make sure your student comes to school in uniform.

- If students come to school in boots, they must bring school shoes to change into when they arrive. Students can not wear snow boots during the school day.
- Students may wear only a STA sweater or sweatshirt with their school uniform. They are not allowed to wear other sweaters or sweatshirts during the school day. If they are in non-uniform


Drop-Off in the Morning

I have seen parents begin dropping off their students in front of the building off of Woodlawn Avenue. This is to make sure our students are safe when arriving in the morning and to prevent traffic from backing up on Woodlawn Avenue. I am going to again remind families to make sure to follow this procedure. Please do NOT drop your child off at Woodlawn Avenue.

We will also post news on the closure on our Facebook page, school website, and on the Illinois School Emergency Closure Center. Please make sure to look for this alert and be prepared for a possible school closure if there is severe weather.
